
Letter from the out-going Chair

Hello Ponkapoagers!

It has been an honor to serve as your Chair. I can't believe it's been four years; it seems like time flies and so much has happened.

Over the last four years there have been many changes Ponkapoag, including getting through Covid, doing more to support our volunteers, finding a new off-season Caretaker, and getting the documentation up to date.

The Covid pandemic shut down Ponkapoag for the first time in the camp's 100 plus year history. Even with camp closed there was a lot of work keeping the cabins safe and secure, and maintaining camp, like repairing a cabin roof after a tree branch fell through it.

Our off-season caretaker, Trisha, who loves camp dearly, retired after 49 years. The search for a replacement was not easy as Trisha set the bar very high. We found a wonderful and enthusiastic new caretaker, Lauren. If you have not met Lauren, take a trip to camp for a day, or weekend, and you'll be warmly welcomed with true Ponk spirit!

We tried to focus on our volunteers by creating a catered appreciation event to recognize the work volunteers do. We also created the annual "Volunteer of the Year" award to recognize outstanding volunteers.

One of the unseen improvements for Ponkapoag is documentation. I know it doesn't seem to rank up there with the sunsets over the pond, but it is equally transformative. The camp has moved its documents to an online shared space, so the information related to the running of the camp is easily accessible to all Ponkapoag Committee members and managers. The documentation includes a newly created Manager's Manual, as well as job descriptions for committee members and managers. Ponkapoag also now has digital records for meetings and annual reports. Laura Gersch created an online document listing all maintenance work needed and completed.

While we have come a long way in the last four years, we can see there are challenges ahead, such as the ongoing need for the lodge and cabin repairs, improving camp occupancy, and as always, engaging new volunteers. We had a big party to celebrate Ponkapoag's centennial, and with those 100 years, Ponkapoag needs repairs. Some can be accomplished at work parties, while others work takes several days to several weeks to complete and requires a contractor. This is an ongoing challenge – identifying skilled volunteers or paid contractors to do the larger jobs. We also need to get cabin rentals back to pre-covid levels. The occupancy at camp this past summer was down compared to pre covid. The costs of running and maintaining the camp are easier to manage if we have more people renting Ponkapoag's cabins. I hear the summer reservations will be available early this year so check your calendars and start planning.


After decades of the same system, we are shifting things to keep up with the rapidly changing world and many people's desire to have their summers sorted out earlier.
